That Saved A Wretch Like Me

"Have you been saved?" "Have you accepted Jesus Christ?" "John 3:16!!" We hear and see these salvation slogans everywhere, it seems. Like everything that really matters at the core of our life, these questions cannot be answered with a yes or no. They are calls to a living faith in Jesus Christ. This course will look at four ways, drawn from the Bible, which the Church developed as ways of saying what "salvation" means. All four are accepted by all Christians in one way or another: Atonement; Justification; Reconciliation; Union in Christ.

Contemporary Issues in Medical Ethics



This class on medical ethics will cover the topics of abortion, stem cell research, choosing genetic traits in children, and euthanasia. Medical professionals will teach alongside theologians to help participants see the issues through the eyes of faith.

Dr. Larry Yoder, Director, Center for Theology and Professor at Lenoir-Rhyne College, Dr. Allan Brett, USC School of Medicine, and Dr. Robert Lebel, Medical Geneticist and Ethicist, Greenwood Genetics Center, and others will teach this course.
